Thursday, October 21 A chamber recital performed by percussionist **John Kinzie**, pianist Stephanie Cheng and guest artists. Rhythm and melody are paired from both piano and percussion instruments with surprising results. Friday, November 19 A double-reed chamber recital is performed by oboists **Ian Wisekal** and Sarah Bierhaus with bassoonist Martin Kuuskmann. All three performers are known internationally for performing recitals as concert soloists and for teaching master classes. Friday, January 14 Violinist **Igor Pikayzen** performs a solo recital with pianist **Tatyana** Pikayzen. Both soloists are laureates of multiple international competitions and have performed around the world to critical acclaim. Friday, January 28 Cellist Matthew Zalkind performs a solo recital with piano. The New York Times praised Matthew for his "impressive refinement, eloquent phrasing and singing tone." Friday, February 4 Clarinetist Jeremy Reynolds performs a solo recital with piano. A passionate educator and performer, Opus Colorado said Jeremy's "playing is full of aplomb and grace and consummate musicality." Friday, February 11 Violinist **Linda Wang** performs a solo recital with pianist **Stephanie** Cheng. Since her debut with Zubin Mehta and the NY Philharmonic at age nine, Linda has performed with orchestras throughout the world. Friday, February 25 Tenor Matthew Plenk and pianist Keith Ward perform a duo recital. Matthew and Keith perform Franz Schubert's expressive song cycle Die schöne Müllerin, in a rare performance of the entire cycle. Friday, April 1 Cellist **Alice Yoo** performs a solo recital. Alice has been warmly hailed for her sensitive musicianship, expressive nuance and passionate commitment to teaching.
