Biography

M. Roger Holland, II is a Teaching Associate Professor in Music and Religion and Director of The Spirituals Project at the Lamont School of Music, University of Denver. A graduate of Union Theological Seminary in New York City where he received the Master of Divinity degree, Roger also served as Artist-in-Residence and director of the Union Gospel Choir for over 13 years. In 2015 Union awarded him the Trailblazers Distinguished Alumni Award, the first given to a graduate whose ministry is music, for his contributions to the legacy of African American music. He received a master's degree in Piano Performance from the Manhattan School of Music, also in New York, and completed his undergraduate work at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey where he majored in Music Education with a concentration in piano and voice.

Roger is the editor of the In Spirit and Truth series published by GIA Publications, Inc., which reflects the aesthetic of Black Catholic worship. Commissioned works include *The Dream* and *The Dreamer*, *The Tribulation Suite*, and *The Call*. In 2023 Roger was recognized by the Association of Catholic Publishers as Composer of the Year and awarded Song of the Year for his composition, "All of Me: Ode to Sr. Thea," in honor of Servant of God Sister Thea Bowman, currently a candidate for canonization. He has played for the Broadway productions of Oprah Winfrey's *The Color Purple* and the Tony award winning show, *Memphis*. In November 2016 Timothy Cardinal Dolan of the Archdiocese of New York presented Roger with the Pierre Toussaint Medallion for service.

Jodel Charles is a software engineer, musical director, composer, producer, and pianist with degrees from the Illinois Institute of Technology and the Boston Conservatory of Music. He began studying piano at the age of seven at École de Musique Solon C. Verret in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. His accomplishments include winning first place at the Best of Chopin des Antilles competition in Guadeloupe and Martinique at fourteen, as well as later performing with the Boston Symphony Orchestra in Stoneham, Massachusetts, and the Colorado Symphony at Denver's Boettcher Concert Hall.

A deeply versatile artist, Jodel has built a career across classical, jazz, R&B, gospel, soul, and neo-soul, performing throughout the U.S. and internationally. He serves as musical director for productions, ensembles, and churches in Boston, Chicago, and Denver, and collaborates with touring artists across the U.S., U.K., Canada, France, the Netherlands, and Austria. His work as a producer includes the Billboard-charting R&B album *Wide Nose Full Lips* (reaching the top 25) as well as numerous live arrangements and recordings.

Jodel is also a composer, blending his classical foundation with contemporary sensibilities. He recently completed a new set of Gospel- and Caribbean-infused acclamations and a full mass for the Oregon Catholic Press and continues to explore new intersections of style in his work. When not performing, you will find him either coding, teaching piano, or making music. He is currently recording a solo piano EP that reflects his musical identity and lifelong commitment to artistic growth.
