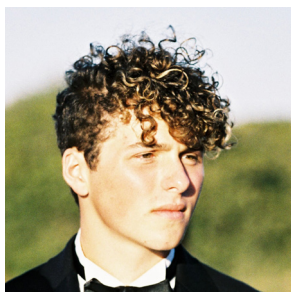

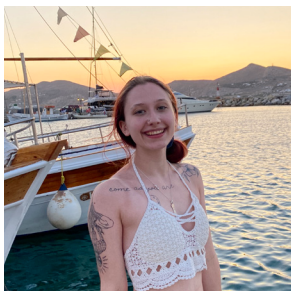
Biographies
